OPTIMIZE YOUR LAMB'S DIET

Clarence Farm Services Ltd. recommends you follow these management practices:

When changing roughages or grain rations, do so gradually. Allow 7 to 10 days for animals to adjust.

Offer high quality roughage and salt free choice at all times. To maximize weight gains lambs should be limit fed forage.

Provide a source of clean, fresh water at all times.

Do not allow fine material to accumulate in feeders. Provide adequate bunk space for each animal. Bunks should be

protected and well managed to prevent feed from becoming wet or moldy.

When feeding from self-feeder, adjust feeder to minimize quantity of feed accumulating in trough.

Feed is perishable: Store in a dry, well-ventilated area protected from rodents and insects.

Do not feed mouldy or insect infested feed to animals as it may cause illness, abortion or death.

Sheep should be vaccinated against enterotoxaemia.

Consult your veterinarian for recommended health programs for your local area. This includes internal and external parasites. These recommendations are intended as a guide.
